GJK Facility Services of Australia Takes Top Award Honors at CoreNet Global Summit *Three Outstanding Companies are also honored with the 2006 Global Innovator's Award Winners*

ORLANDO and ATLANTA – **13 November 2006** — Victoria, Australia's GJK Facility Services is a winner today of the 8th annual **H.
